Online QDA (<http://onlineqda.hud.ac.uk/index.php>)

This site provides a wealth of learning materials for those undertaking qualitative data analysis and for those using Computer Assisted Qualitative Data Analysis (CAQDAS) programs. Click “How to use” for a 4-minute video that introduces users to the web site. Especially useful for novice researchers are pages on data preparation, coding, and writing, and audio and video tutorials on developing, revising, and simplifying the coding scheme.

Five Short Videos from a Lecture on Grounded Theory

This set of videos, available on the Online QDA web site, provide an excellent introduction to grounded theory methods. Professor Graham Gibbs covers the core elements of grounded theory methods, explains open, axial, and selective coding, and discusses important grounded theorists and critiques of grounded theory.
