

Practice Case: Madison

Madison completed the MMPI-2-RF-EX as part of the intake procedures at a multidisciplinary medical center's mental health unit. Madison was referred for treatment by her dentist who noted evidence of enamel erosion consistent with frequent vomiting. Both the MMPI-2-RF and the MMPI-3 score reports were derived from the same test administration.

Madison is a 22-year-old White woman. She graduated from high school and completed a nursing program at her local community college. She is employed full-time as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) at a skilled care facility for elderly adults. She reports that she finds her work fulfilling but stressful. Madison socializes regularly with a large number of acquaintances, but she has no friends with whom she is close. She is not currently in a romantic relationship and has not been involved in a serious relationship for close to two years.

Madison is the middle child. She has a younger sister who is in college and an older sister who is a mortician. Madison's parents are divorced. Her father is also a mortician and runs the family business along with her older sister. Her mother works as a personal financial asset consultant at a large bank. Her mother has bipolar disorder and experiences a manic episode about once every three or four years. Madison reports that she is not close with her family although she maintains superficial contact with all of them.

Madison reports that she feels she has little control in her life outside of her work. She reports a long history of dissatisfaction with her weight and body shape as well as a history of extreme dieting. She admitted to her dentist that she has been regularly vomiting over the past year to try to control her weight. Madison also reports that she struggles with anxiety and says that she becomes easily frustrated with others. Most of her romantic relationships and friendships have ended when she breaks things off following a disagreement.

Madison appeared attentive and focused during test administration. She worked quickly and efficiently without taking any breaks.

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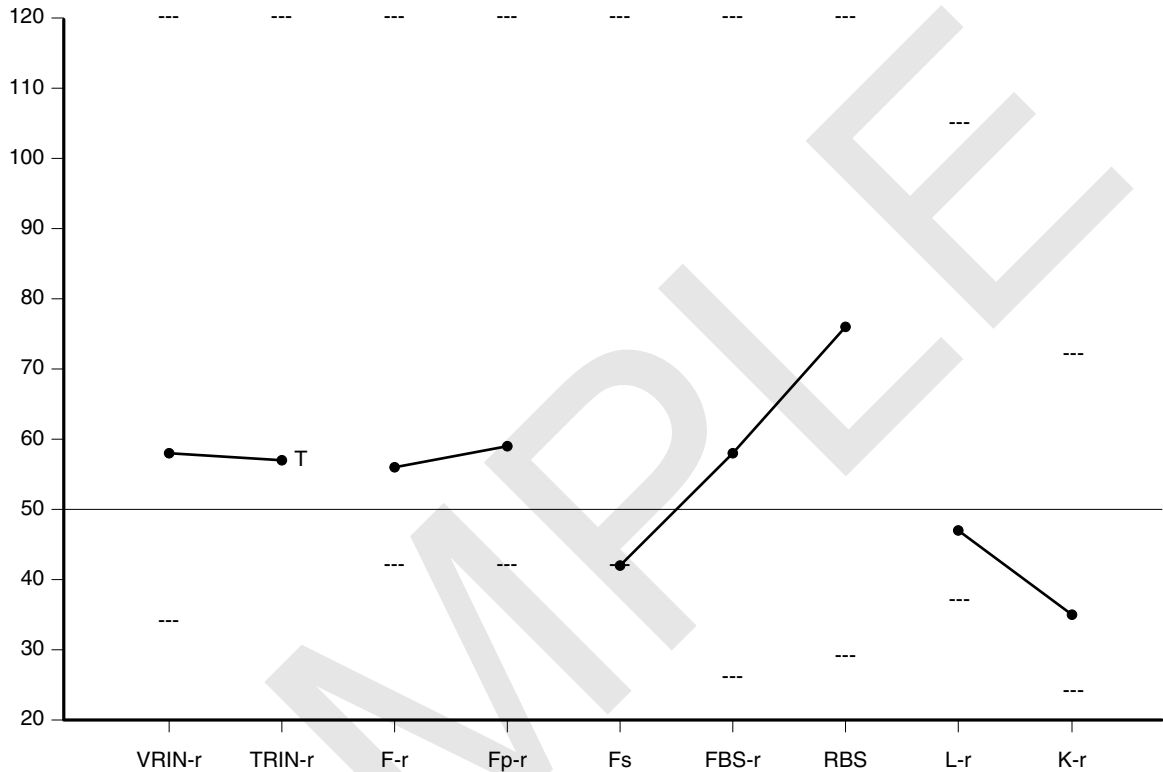

MMPI-2-RF Higher-Order (H-O) and Restructured Clinical (RC) Scales

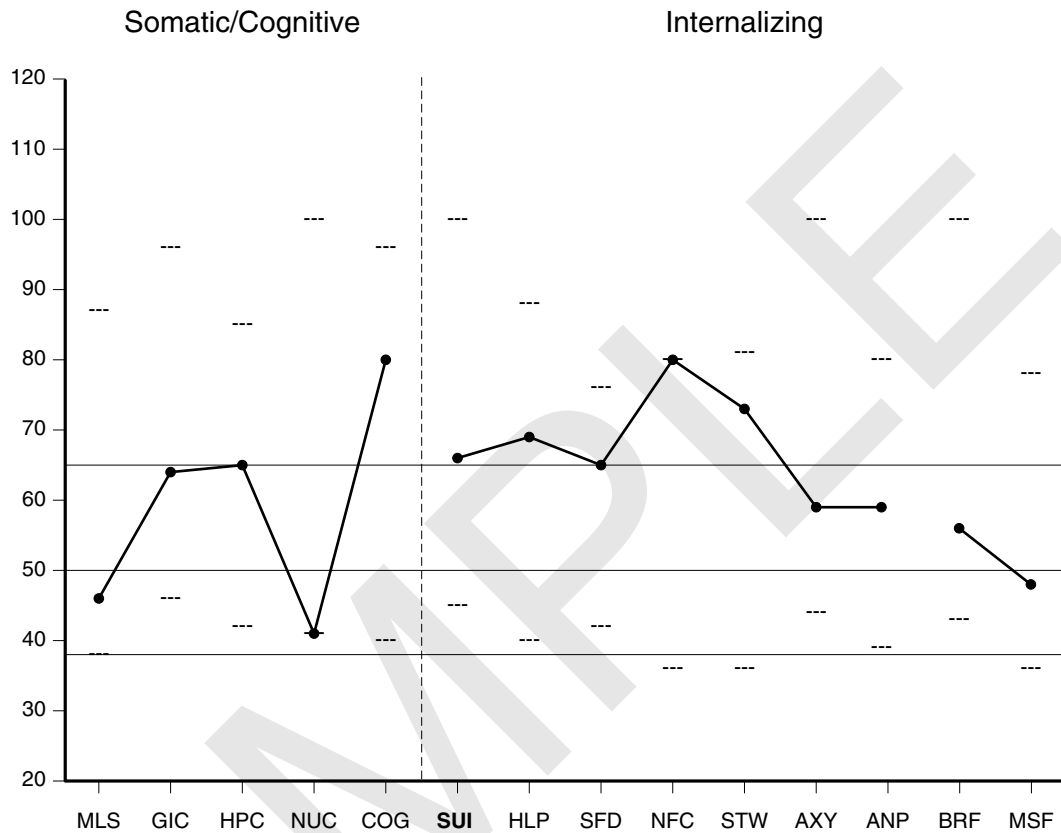

MMPI-2-RF Somatic/Cognitive and Internalizing Scales

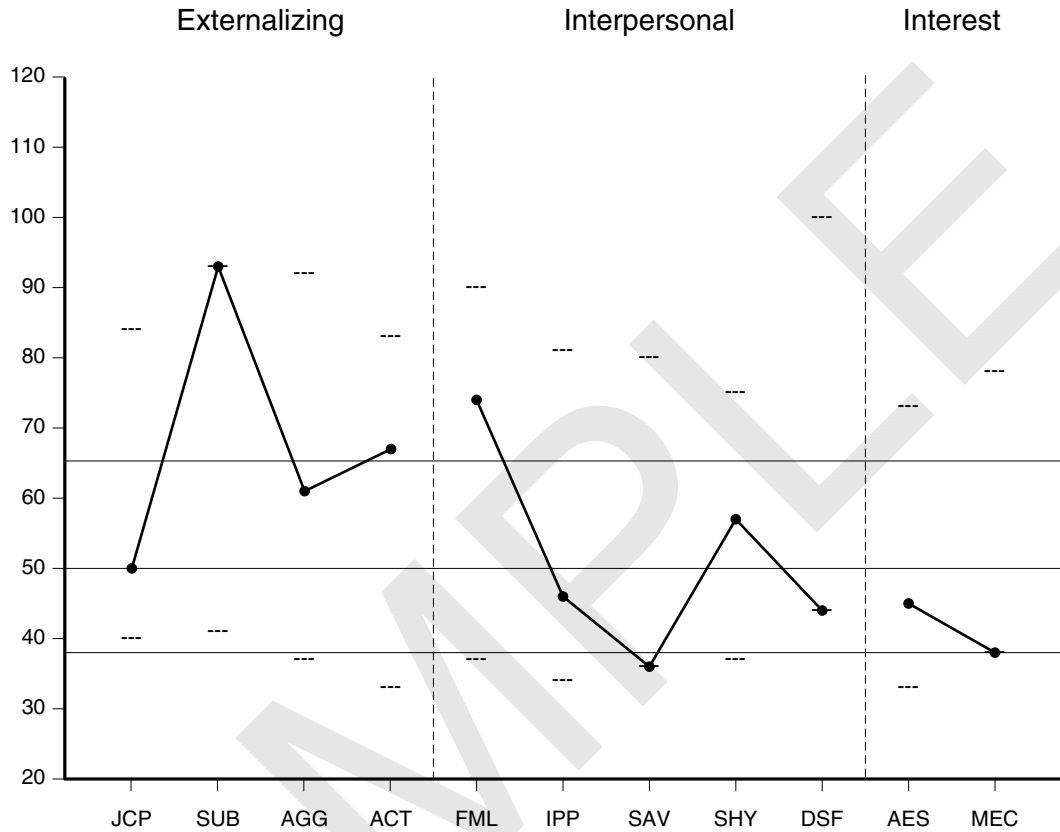

MMPI-2-RF Externalizing, Interpersonal, and Interest Scales

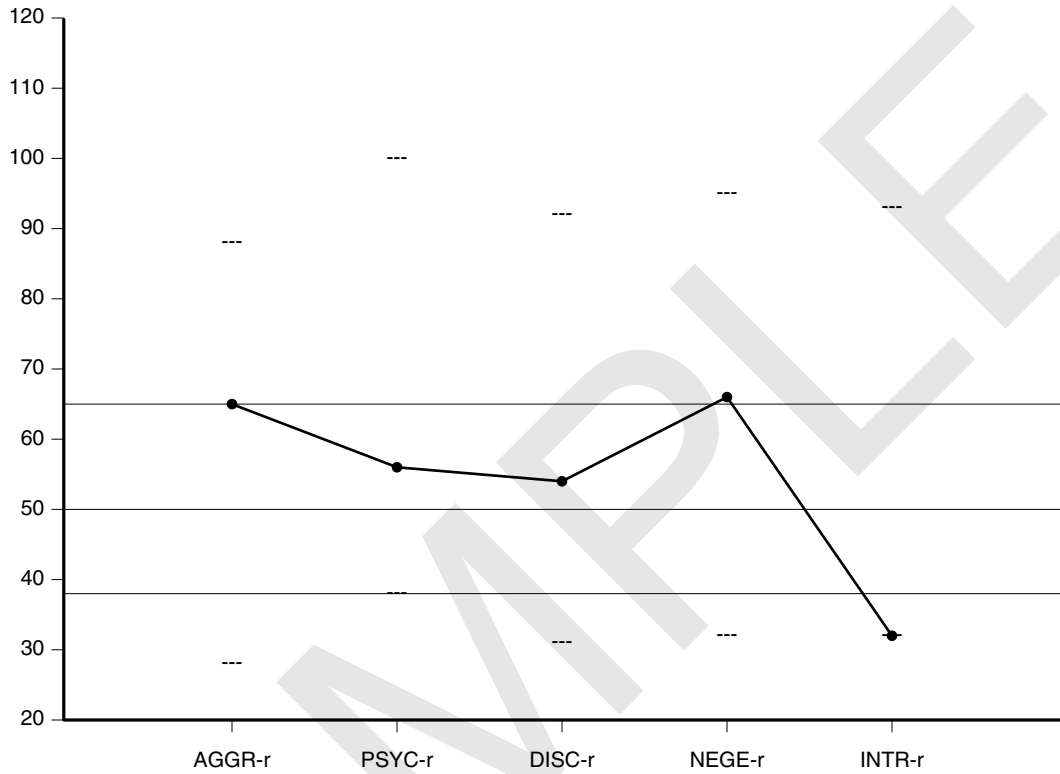
